**REVISED CP-1** - Motion Approving Amendment to Proprietary Vendor List and Approving Contract for Proprietary Purchase and Installation of Flap Gates, Pumps and Equipment Restoration at Stormstations 1 and 2 – MWI

Corporation – \$179,569 – (Commission District 4)

# **Recommendation**

It is recommended that the City Commission approve an amendment to the proprietary vendor list from CAM 19-0277 and change the name of vendor #22 from FPI Pumps, Inc. (FPI) to MWI Corporation (MWI) and approve a contract, in substantially the form attached, for the proprietary purchase and installation of flap gates, pumps and equipment restoration at Stormstations 1 and 2 from MWI at a cost of \$179,569.

## **Background**

Built in 1969, Stormstation 1 located at 120 SW 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue and Stormstation 2 located at 100 N. New River Drive are responsible for pumping down the storm system in the downtown area at two-point discharges/outfalls to the New River. The stormstations' equipment requires repair and/or replacement at intervals in order to maintain the existing operational needs and the level of service to our neighbors. A lack of maintenance will result in both increases in the intensity and duration of upland flooding events.

Stormstation 1 requires new flood gates to prevent seawater from entering the wet well. New motors are also being installed to allow the stormstation to run more efficiently. In addition, Stormstations 1 and 2 will be serviced to be restored to their original functioning capacity.

MWI purchased FPI in November of 2019. MWI is the sole source for the custom engineered and fabrication of pumping equipment used in Stormstations 1 and 2. They are the only entity that can restore the MWI pumps back to the Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEM) specifications.

Pursuant to Section 2-181(f)(3), Code of Ordinances of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, the City may purchase proprietary items, as defined in Section 2-173, without

competitive solicitation. As defined by the Code, a proprietary item is not readily available from more than one supplier, manufacturer, or person and is unique in nature without competitive solicitation.

### **Resource Impact**

There will be a fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$162,369 for Stormstation 1, and \$17,200 for Stormstation 2, for a total of \$179,569. Funds in the amount of \$179,569 are available in the FY2020 in the Index Codes listed below:
