TITLE: Resolutions Adopting the Fiscal Year 2021 Sunrise Key Neighborhood Improvement District Tentative Millage Rate and Tentative Budget - (1) Tentative Millage Rate (1.0000) and (2) Tentative Budget - **(Commission District 2)**

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission hold a Public Hearing to review the proposed millage rate and to adopt a resolution approving the tentative Fiscal Year (FY) 2021 Sunrise Key Neighborhood Improvement District Millage Rate and a resolution adopting the tentative FY 2021 Sunrise Key Neighborhood Improvement District Budget.

Background

The Sunrise Key Neighborhood Improvement District (SKNID) is a local government neighborhood improvement district created by Ordinance C-92-12 in accordance with Section 163.506, Florida Statutes. The District is authorized to levy ad valorem tax on real and personal property up to two mills annually to generate revenue to provide security services. The revenue is collected via tax bills by the Broward County Tax Collector and is electronically transmitted to the City. The funds are set aside in a trust account for the District and are subsequently reimbursed to the District.

The Sunrise Key Neighborhood Improvement District set its millage rate at 1.0000 mill and established its budget of \$110,000 at its June 17, 2020 meeting. Revenue generated from this millage rate is estimated at \$136,652, which will support the budget as detailed in the Sunrise Key Neighborhood Improvement District Minutes (Exhibit 1).

Resource Impact

The City's FY 2021 Tentative Budget includes the SKNID revenues and expenditures because it is a dependent district.

Strategic Connections
