TITLE: Second Reading-Ordinance Amending the City of Fort Lauderdale

General Employees' Retirement System - (Commission Districts 1, 2, 3

and 4)

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the City Commission adopt an ordinance amending the City's General Employees' Retirement System ("Plan") to implement provisions from collective bargaining agreements and to give the Plan members the option to join the Florida Retirement System ("FRS").

Background

The City Commission has determined that it is in the best interest of the City for all employees other than police officers and firefighters (collectively known as "general employees") to join the Florida Retirement System on January 1, 2021, or as soon thereafter as administratively feasible.

The Federation of Public Employees, a Division of the National Federation of Public and Private Employees, AFL-CIO ("FPE") and the Teamsters Local Union No. 769, Affiliated with the International Brotherhood of Teamsters ("Teamsters"), which represents bargaining units of the City's general employees, ratified collective bargaining agreements covering the period October 1, 2019, through September 30, 2022. The FPE and Teamsters collective bargaining agreements provide for certain changes to the Plan, most notably a provision that gives Plan members the option to participate in the FRS. To implement the retirement changes in the FPE and Teamsters collective bargaining agreements, an ordinance amending the Plan is necessary.

The following is a summary of the proposed amendments:

- Section 20-106, Plan established; purpose; effective date
 - Adding sub-section (b) to provide for the City joining the FRS and providing Plan members an opportunity to elect to continue participating in the Plan or enroll in FRS for future service.
- Section 20-108.1, Optional Participation; City Sponsored Defined Contribution

Plan; Florida Retirement System.

 Adding sub-section (f) to provide a procedure for eligible employees to elect to continue participating in the Plan or enroll in FRS for future service.

The City Commission passed the first reading of the ordinance at the October 6, 2020 Commission Meeting.

Resource Impact

There is no fiscal impact for Fiscal Year 2021 associated with this action.
