




WHERE ARE WE

- Summary of participation
 - 6,452 Virtual Open House Visits
 - 4,700 Comment Portal Views
 - 1,164 participants provided3,468 comments and responses
 - 534 participants left contact information

- 13 require follow up







Greenfield Park - Proposed Improvements






Staff Input


CRITERIA FOR PHASES
