

PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT SUMMARY

- Summary of participation
 - 6,452 Virtual Open House Visits
 - 4,700 Comment Portal Views
 - 1,164 participants provided 3,468 comments and responses
 - 534 participants left contact information

PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT SUMMARY

- Concurrence
 - 90 total parks
 - 55 have full concurrence
 - 13 minor corrections
 - 9 New Parks to be designed
 - 13 require follow up

 - Access to parks
 - Community facilities
 - Canoe / Kayak Launches
 - Dog parks
 - More trees
 - Natural areas and beautification
 - Open spaces / passive areas

 - Water access and shoreline improvements



- Common Themes:
 - Playground Upgrades / Swings
 - Shade
 - Pavilion
 - Happy with Improvements!

- Top Priorities:
 - Playground – Shade and Surfacing
 - Swings on Playground
 - Pavilion
 - High-efficiency, no-light spill lighting

PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT SUMMARY

- Staff Input
 - Fort Lauderdale Parks and Recreation Staff were provided with a separate portal to provide their input
 - Intended to provide operational and maintenance insight for the proposed improvements

PRIORITIZATION STRATEGY

- Balance the need for effective public input with the desire to move projects ahead
- A multi-team approach to advance as many projects as possible simultaneously




CRITERIA FOR PHASES

Methodology is a Balance of Art and Science

- 1 Identified Signature Projects
- 2 Community consensus on the park development program
- 3 Equitable distribution of projects across the City
- 4 Potential for grants or leveraging bond funds
- 5 Efficiency of design, bidding and construction
