\$3,539.25 - (Commission Districts 1, 2, 3 and 4)

Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission approve a motion authorizing the City Manager to accept a donation of DuoDote® Auto-Injectors (Atropine and Pralidoxime chloride injection) for Fire Rescue's Hazardous Materials Team and to execute any documents required to accept the equipment between Broward County Healthcare Coalition and the City of Fort Lauderdale.

Background

The Broward Healthcare Coalition (BCHC) has funded a grant to enhance participating agencies (4 Hazmat EMS/Fire Rescue agencies) capabilities by distributing DuoDote® Auto-Injector (atropine and pralidoxime chloride injection), for intramuscular use to participating agencies that meet the BCHC attendance requirements. The goal of the DuoDote® distribution is to enhance the participating agency's ability to treat patients suspected of poisoning by organophosphorus nerve agents as well as organophosphorus insecticides in adults and pediatric patients weighing more than 41 kg (90 pounds).

Fort Lauderdale Fire Rescue's Hazardous Materials Team (Hazmat) is included in the Broward County Healthcare Coalition's grant as the City is an active member of the coalition. Fort Lauderdale Fire Rescue will receive the following:

Sixty (60) DuoDote® autoinjectors @ \$58.99/ea.= \$3,539.25

Resource Impact

This action will result in a positive impact to the city. The value of the donated equipment/autoinjectors is \$3,539.25
