**TITLE:** Public Hearing - Beach Business Improvement District Annual Rate  
Resolution for Fiscal Year 2022 - **(Commission District 2)**

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**Recommendation**

Staff recommends the City Commission hold a public hearing and adopt the Annual Rate Resolution establishing an assessment rate of \$0.8525 per \$1,000 of assessed property value for Fiscal Year (FY) 2022 and approving the FY 2022 Assessment Roll.

**Background**

On October 3, 2006, the City of Fort Lauderdale authorized the imposition of an annual Beach Business Improvement Assessment to fund all or any portion of cost of the provision of Beach Business Improvement services, facilities, or programs that provide a special benefit to assessed business properties (Ordinance C-06-34). The City adopted Preliminary Rate Resolution No. 21-140 on July 6, 2021, in accordance with Section of Ordinance No. C-06-34. The Resolution, among other things, established an estimated assessment rate, set forth a brief description of the services to be provided, and determined the costs for the upcoming year. The non-ad valorem assessment rate of \$0.8525 per \$1,000 of assessed property value which is estimated to generate \$999,613 in revenue to the Beach Business Improvement District Fund.

The City Manager is required per state statute to certify the non-ad valorem assessment rate to the Broward County Tax Collector no later than September 15, 2021.

**Resource Impact**

There is no fiscal impact for FY 2021. This Non-Ad Valorem Assessment will generate approximately \$999,613 in revenue in FY 2022.
