TITLE: Public Hearing - Resolution Adopting the Fiscal Year 2022 Fire Assessment and Assessment Roll for Provision of Fire Services, Programs and Facilities - (Commission Districts 1, 2, 3 and 4)

### **Recommendation**

Staff recommends the City Commission adopt the annual rate resolution for the Fire Assessment for the City of Fort Lauderdale for Fiscal Year (FY) 2022, beginning October 1, 2021 and ending September 30, 2022.

#### **Background**

The City Commission authorized the creation of the Fire Assessment Program to fund the fire services, facilities, and/or programs that will benefit the City in its entirety, such as facility improvements, special equipment, and cost of fire suppression operations on June 15, 1999 (Ordinance C-99-49). The City adopted the Preliminary Rate Resolution No. 21-139 on July 6, 2021, in accordance with Section 2.08 of Ordinance C-99-49. The resolution, among other things, established an assessment rate to fund continued fire services and operations for FY 2022.

The City proposes a rate of \$311 per single family residential property. For FY 2022, the proposed assessment is \$50,121,551 which is estimated to generate \$48,619,111 in revenue to the General Fund based upon an estimated collection rate of 97%.

Pursuant to Fla. Stat. § 197.3632(5)(a), the chair of the local governing board or his or her designee is required to certify the non-ad valorem assessment roll to the Broward County Tax Collector no later than September 15, 2021.

### Resource Impact

This assessment will generate approximately \$48,619,111 in revenue to support the General Fund budget for FY 2022.
