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### Section A

1. **Summary of the proposed ordinance, to include the public purpose to be served by the proposed ordinance, such as serving the public health, safety, morals, and welfare of the City. Ordinance Amending the Charter of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, Article VIII, Public Property, Section 8.01 - Sale of Personal Property, 8.02 - Sale or Lease of City Property to Public Bodies, 8.04 - Sale of Real Property to Private Parties, 8.07 - Leases with Governmental Entities or Agencies for Governmental Purposes, 8.09 - Leases for More Than One Year and Not More Than Fifty Years**
2. **Estimate of direct economic impact of the proposed ordinance on private, for-profit businesses in the City. If any type of business seeks to lease, licenses, become a concessionaire, or enter into a use agreement, the City, at the businesses expense will perform a fair market analysis, provide the qualifications of the private party prepared by an independent consultant , and a business viability report.**

Exact costs to businesses will be dependent on the current market based costs of the aforementioned analysis and evaluations. Pursuit of public lands is voluntary so any private business subject to the costs will do so on their own volition.**
  - b. **Identification of any new charge or fee on businesses subject to the proposed ordinance or for which businesses will be financially responsible. Costs associated with the ordinance will be to comply with the proposed requirements to lease, license, or enter into a use agreement. Costs to private businesses will be based on the market value at the time for the fair market analysis, applicant's qualifications report, and business viability report that area prepared at the private party's expense in exchange for the right to lease, license, or enter into a use agreement for City property.**
  - c. **An estimate of the City's regulatory costs, including an estimate of revenues from any new charges or fees that will be imposed on businesses to cover such costs.**
3. **Good faith estimates of the number of businesses likely to be impacted by the proposed ordinance. There will likely be a nominal number of businesses impacted by the proposed ordinances. Only businesses that choose to engage with the City for the right to purchase, lease, license, or enter into a use agreement will be impacted.**
