TITLE: Preliminary Annual Assessment Resolution for the Stormwater Assessment
Initiating the Process for Imposing the Fiscal Year 2027 Non-Ad Valorem
Assessment and Authorizing a Public Hearing on September 14, 2026 -
(Commission Districts 1, 2, 3 and 4)

Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission adopt a preliminary annual assessment resolution initiating the process for imposing the Non-Ad Valorem Stormwater Assessment and establish the date of September 14, 2026, at 5:01 P.M. at the Fort Lauderdale Police Department, 1300 West Broward Boulevard, Community Room #1004, Fort Lauderdale, FL 33312 to hold a public hearing to consider public comments.

Background

On June 16, 2020, the City Commission authorized the creation of a Stormwater Management Program Assessment. To fund the planning, construction, operation, maintenance, and administration of a public stormwater management system, an assessment has been developed for each benefited parcel at a rate based on the special benefit accruing to such parcel from the provision of a stormwater management system (CAM #20-0383, Ordinance No. C-20-18). The City must adopt an Annual Assessment Resolution to approve the assessment roll to fund the Stormwater Management Program.

The Fiscal Year (FY) 2027 recommended Stormwater Assessment is twenty percent (20%) higher than the FY 2026 Stormwater Assessment.

The City Manager is required per Section 197.3632 (5)(a), Florida Statutes to certify the non-ad valorem assessment rate to the Broward County Tax Collector no later than September 15, 2026.

Resource Impact

For FY 2027, the proposed assessment is \$49,858,611, which is estimated to generate \$47,864,266 in revenues in FY 2027.
