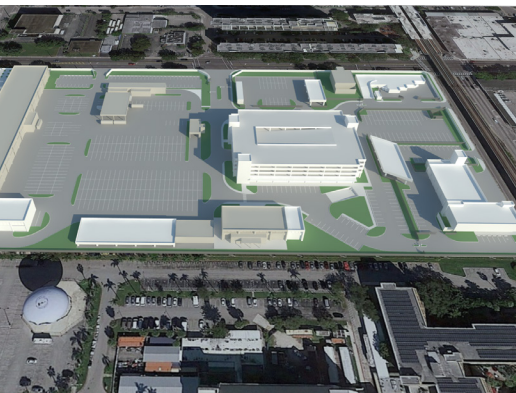
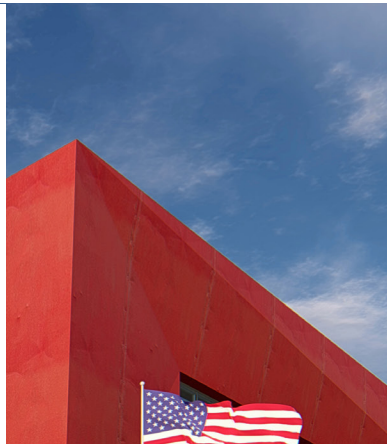

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

WA is a local Miami-Dade County architecture and engineering firm nationally recognized for outstanding achievement and performance. Since 1976, WA has been involved and taken a leadership role in the planning, design, documentation and construction administration for a multitude of diverse project types. The firm’s projects have included new construction, expansion, renovations, and improvements.

WA offers the depth of resources for the successful completion of project types normally associated with a general services commission, and we are confident that we have the right team of professionals, experience and ability to respond to the City’s needs. With a stable staffing level and exceptional professional expertise, WA has been able to respond to projects of any scope and complexity from small to large, with the personal contact and attention to detail required for efficient and responsive service. In its 45+ years of service, WA has been involved with dozens of general services agreements.

Approach to the Project

The WA Team will be organized beginning with, the Principal-in-Charge (PIC), Marcel R. Morlote, R.A, who will direct the overall effort of the Team, and will be responsible for allocating personnel, financial and production resources necessary to execute the work plan and accomplish the project’s goals and objectives. The PIC, working closely with the Project Manager, will monitor the project’s progress to ensure adherence to contractual terms and conduct periodic audits of schedule and technical performance.

The Project Manager, Raul Estevez, will be the team’s single point of contact for the City. The Project Manager will be responsible for assigning resources of the Team to the various work tasks and maintaining regular communication as to progress of work with the City’s Project Manager. Mr. Estevez will oversee the overall design and production effort and will monitor project schedule and identify issues in order for them to be resolved in a timely manner. He will establish and implement the Team’s quality control process and will be responsible for scheduling internal project reviews of all submittals before they are delivered to the City. Mr. Estevez has significant experience managing similar general services commissions for the firm and has been an employee for 40+ years. Currently, he is managing other similar agreements.



APPROACH

As an integral part of our approach and prior to beginning execution of the project, WA will schedule a kick-off meeting with key personnel and stakeholders from the City to discuss the project in detail, construction budget, schedule and project goals. From that discussion we will develop a plan of action. This plan will outline all important issues for dialogue and develop a format for facilitating input. One of the key points typically associated with renovation projects is to determine the impact that the proposed improvements have on the existing building and how the building department will opine on the level of renovation as defined by the Florida Building Code. Our experience is that most commissions associated with general services contracts are for renovations and additions versus new construction.

Coordination

We typically visit the site as a team with all of the involved disciplines. This results in a better and more comprehensive understanding of the required scope and the impact one discipline has on another. This information is used to more accurately develop construction cost estimates. The estimate is presented to the City and input solicited prior to moving forward.

An initial site visit will introduce the design project team to the City, and as noted in the scope of work, will serve to assess existing site conditions. Team members will participate in periodic project meetings to discuss the project progress, proposed construction tasks, identify potential problems, work out solutions and continue the exchange of project information.

Cost Control Methods

Recognizing the critical importance of cost management, WA will commence cost control procedures immediately upon issuance of the Notice to Proceed. WA will perform construction cost estimates with in-house personnel.

Schedule Control Methods

WA takes pride in an outstanding record for responsiveness to established schedules. In the execution of similar work, the firm has always met schedule demands. Our schedule methodology for any particular project will be accomplished through proven management procedures combined with a productive project team and an ongoing schedule evaluation process. A formal schedule will be developed to respond to the specific needs of each task and the Project Manager will regularly meet with City personnel to review schedule progress and requirements. In-house weekly status meetings will allow for quick response as needed and the firm's staffing depth will ensure the availability of the resources to respond to schedule demands.

Quality Control

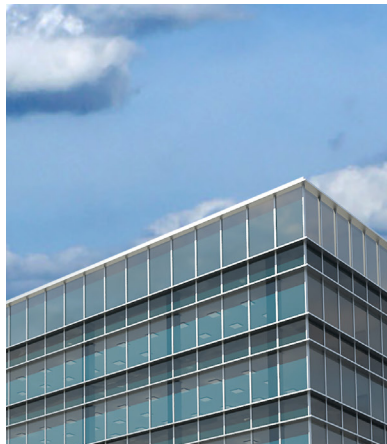
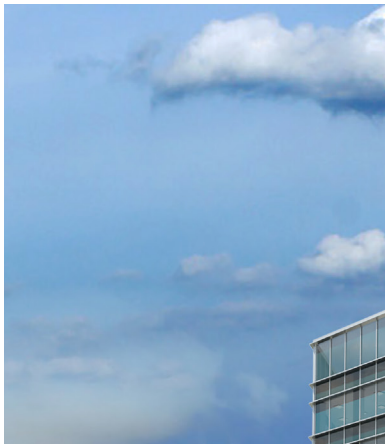

APPROACH

As an integral part of our approach and prior to beginning execution of the project, WA will schedule a kick-off meeting with key personnel and stakeholders from the City to discuss the project in detail, construction budget, schedule and project goals. From that discussion we will develop a plan of action. This plan will outline all important issues for dialogue and develop a format for facilitating input. One of the key points typically associated with renovation projects is to determine the impact that the proposed improvements have on the existing building and how the building department will opine on the level of renovation as defined by the Florida Building Code. Our experience is that most commissions associated with general services contracts are for renovations and additions versus new construction.

Coordination

We typically visit the site as a team with all of the involved disciplines. This results in a better and more comprehensive understanding of the required scope and the impact one discipline has on another. This information is used to more accurately develop construction cost estimates. The estimate is presented to the City and input solicited prior to moving forward.

An initial site visit will introduce the design project team to the City, and as noted in the scope of work, will serve to assess existing site conditions. Team members will participate in periodic project meetings to discuss the project progress, proposed construction tasks, identify potential problems, work out solutions and continue the exchange of project information.

Cost Control Methods
