TITLE: Public Hearing - Resolution Approving a Waiver of Conflict of Interest Pursuant to Section 112.313(12), Florida Statutes Allowing Kimber White to Apply for the Central City Community Redevelopment Area Residential Enhancement Program - **(Commission Districts 2 and 3)**

Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission adopt a resolution approving a waiver of a conflict of interest as authorized under Section 112.313(12), Florida Statutes to allow Central City Redevelopment Area Advisory Board (CCRAAB) member Kimber White to apply for benefits under the Central City Community Redevelopment Area Residential Enhancement Program.

Background

The Florida Code of Ethics is applicable to City board and committee members, who are public officers. Pursuant to Florida Statute Section 112.313(3), a public officer is prohibited from doing business with one's agency and under 112.313(7), a public officer shall not have or hold any employment or contractual relationship with any business entity which is subject to the regulation of, or is doing business with, an agency of which he or she is an officer or employee. This prohibition, however, may be waived by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the City Commission pursuant to the process found in Florida Statutes Section 112.313(12).

Kimber White currently serves on the CCRAAB and is a resident of the South Middle River Neighborhood. Mr. White is serving his second term on the CCRAAB and his term runs from November 21, 2025, through November 20, 2026. If a board member enters into an incentive agreement with the Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA), it may create a conflict under Section 112.313(7), Florida Statutes, as a prohibited contractual or business relationship. Mr. White has requested a waiver under Florida Statute Section 112.313(12), which allows the City Commission, by a two-thirds (2/3) vote, to approve an exception to the prohibition in Section 112.313(7).

The Central City Residential Enhancement Program provides funding for eligible exterior improvements to residential properties located within the Central City Redevelopment area. Improvements are intended to strengthen a property's curb appeal and overall community cohesion. The program is designed to incentivize property owners and occupants to enhance their homes, while supporting neighborhood revitalization. Funding is available in varying amounts depending on property types. Detached homestead single-family and selected owner-occupied multi-family properties may receive funding of up to \$10,000. Investor-owned or tenant-occupied residential properties may receive funding of up to \$5,000. Returning applicants from the previous residential program may qualify for funding of up to \$5,000 for new eligible improvements not previously covered.

Eligible enhancements include exterior painting, front-yard landscaping, installation or repair of sprinkler or irrigation systems, driveway and fence repair or upgrades, front-of-property façade lighting affixed to the building, and front-yard tree trimming. These improvements are intended to enhance the visual appeal of individual properties and contribute to a community-wide safer, more welcoming environment.

In Fiscal Year (FY) 2026, the Central City Redevelopment Agency has allocated \$200,000 to the Residential Enhancement Program. All applicants for the Residential Enhancement Program are awarded on a first-come, first-served basis. To date, there are currently ten (10) pending applications totaling \$65,000, leaving \$135,000 available to fund the Program for the remainder of FY 2026.

A copy of the Central City Residential Enhancement Program description, application, and agreements is provided as Exhibit 1. Participation in this program requires the execution of agreements between the applicant and the Community Redevelopment Agency.
