5	For-hire Low Speed Vehicles	City Commission would like to know how many vehicles will be operating under the for-hire low speed vehicles. In addition, they are requesting an operation and regulation plan for these vehicles.	05/26/2026 - The revamped Vehicle for Hire (VFH) Program launched May 26, 2026. The updated program streamlines permitting, limits City-issued permits to sightseeing/low-speed vehicles and pedicabs and directs all other VFH types to Broward County per State Statute. Application processing is now fully administrative, with new fees collected by Parking Services. The Fort Lauderdale Police Department will assume full enforcement responsibilities, with all permitted operators listed online. The program will migrate to LauderBuild in FY 2027 to improve workflow integration. Staff in Transportation and Mobility will serve as the primary point of contact for application intake and review. 5	E-Bikes	Commissioner Glassman expressed concern about the increase in bad e-bike behavior.
