TITLE: Motion Approving Grant Application to the FY 2026 Florida Inland
Navigation District Waterways Assistance Program - \$460,770 -
(Commission Districts 1, 2, 3 and 4)

Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission approve a motion authorizing the submission of a grant application under the Fiscal Year (FY) 2026 Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) Waterways Assistance Program.

Background

The Waterways Assistance Program provides funding assistance to local governments to perform waterway improvement projects, facilitate safety programs and acquire marine equipment. The program will fund up to fifty percent (50%) of project costs, with a maximum FIND share of \$125,000. The grant period is October 1, 2026 through September 30, 2028.

Funding is being requested to obtain a new vessel to expand Fort Lauderdale Police Department's (FLPD) Marine Unit fleet capacity which will enhance waterway patrols, emergency response, and public safety operational support. The FLPD Marine Unit is tasked with maintaining and promoting boating safety throughout the City's 165 miles of navigable waterways and 7 miles of coastline. Marine Unit officers accomplish this by providing boater safety information to residents and visitors; conducting area checks of key marine locations; performing vessel stops and/or conducting additional safety inspections of vessels; issuing warnings and citations for noted violations; and preventing boating accidents through high visibility patrol activities.

The FIND program application process requires all applicants to obtain approval from its governing board or commission via the submission of an official resolution. The total project cost is \$460,770. As a result of the program's matching component, if awarded, the grant will fund \$125,000 and the City's matching portion will be \$335,770. The Department is requesting that funds for the required match be appropriated from the General Fund.

Resource Impact

The total project cost is \$460,770. If awarded, there is an anticipated positive fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$125,000. Full implementation of the grant will require the City to appropriate \$335,770 from the General Fund.
