TITLE: 2026 Storm Season Preparedness – City Manager’s Office and Fire
Rescue Department (**Commission Districts 1, 2, 3 and 4**)

The Atlantic hurricane season begins on June 1, 2026, and ends on November 30, 2026. The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) announced its 2026 Atlantic hurricane season outlook on May 21, 2026. The presentation includes the anticipated activity for the 2026 Atlantic hurricane season, factors that may influence hurricane development, and opportunities for the public to stay informed and be prepared.

City staff will provide the City Commission with an update on the storm season planning efforts, stormwater operations plans and improvements, sandbag distribution events, communications, and resources available to the public.

The presentation will also feature the annual “Eye of the Storm” event, held in partnership with Florida International University, Florida Division of Emergency Management, and the Museum of Discovery and Science. This free, citywide public preparedness initiative is designed to educate residents, businesses, and visitors on hurricane readiness, emergency preparedness, and community resilience. The event is scheduled for May 30, 2026, from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Note that this item was originally scheduled for the May 19, 2026, City Commission Conference Meeting agenda, but was deferred.
