TITLE: Resolution Authorizing the City Manager to Execute a State-Funded Grant Agreement with the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) for the Construction Phase of the Fort Lauderdale Roadway Resurfacing Project – \$750,000 – (**Commission District 3**)

Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission approve a resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute a State-Funded Grant Agreement between the City of Fort Lauderdale (City) and Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) for the Construction Phase of the Fort Lauderdale Roadway Resurfacing Project in the amount of \$750,000.

Background

The purpose of the Roadway Resurfacing Project (Project) is to improve and maintain the Pavement Condition Index (PCI) scores for the 564 miles of roadway within City of Fort Lauderdale jurisdiction. A PCI score is measured on a scale of zero (0) to one hundred (100), where one hundred (100) indicates a newly paved road. Roadways with a PCI of fifty-five (55) and below are considered to be in poor condition. The PCI score is affected by several factors such as pavement age, climate and precipitation, traffic loads, and maintenance. The Project focuses on milling and resurfacing roadways citywide with a PCI score below fifty-five (55), as identified in the Citywide 2025 inspection data report.

On June 18, 2024, the City Commission approved a motion to approve an agreement for the Annual Asphalt Mill and Resurfacing project, with M & M Asphalt Maintenance Inc. in the amount of \$4,000,000, and authorized the City Manager to approve two (2), one(1)-year renewal options, in the annual renewal amount of \$2,000,000, for a potential total contract amount of \$8,000,000 (CAM# 24-0580).

To help fund the cost of this ongoing Project, the City applied for \$850,000 in Fiscal Year 2025/2026 General Appropriation Act grant funding in April 2025. In November 2025, FDOT notified the City that it had been awarded \$750,000. The Project includes milling and resurfacing the existing pavement citywide, however the awarded grant funds will be used to resurface pavement in the Sunset Neighborhood per the grant funding agreement.

If approved and after the agreement is fully executed, the City will utilize an existing contract to complete the roadway milling and resurfacing work, which is expected to take three (3) weeks to complete.

Resource Impact

This action will result in a positive impact to the City in the amount of \$750,000. There is no match funding required from the City to accept this grant. The award will be appropriated through the Consolidated Budget Amendment, if approved, which will be presented at the June 2, 2026, City Commission Regular Meeting (CAM# 26-0064).
